t: is a conifer (cone-bearing tree) native to the Rocky Mountains.

2: is a maple relative growing in open areas whose leaves are divided into three to five leaflets; SUGAR MAPLE leaves are five-lobed.

 $\begin{array}{ccc} \textbf{3:} & \textbf{A} \quad \text{is easily identified by its "mossy-cupped" acorn; its inner bark is known to have medicinal properties. \end{array}$
